

Dear Friends in Christ,

June 10, 2020

Essentially, the number of churchgoers has doubled from the first to the second weekend. The 4 PM Mass, less so; the 10 AM, more so. On Pentecost, we had 40-50 people per Mass and on Trinity Sunday we had 75-115 people per Mass. There's room for more!

It's my understanding that some people have felt un-invited – even rejected – when reading the May 24 bulletin: “I want to assure everyone that the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday is dispensed. Bishop Callahan ‘encourages those over 65 and particularly those with underlying health conditions to stay home.’ I fully agree, especially as we begin this new experiment.” I expressed my agreement with the bishop's advice primarily because I had heard many words of caution – and even fear – about attending Mass. Everyone should feel comfortable with the idea of remaining safe at home. I also heard some adult children worried that their parents were going to take “unnecessary risks” and “feel obligated to attend.” Again, I wanted everyone to know the obligation is lifted and it is safer at home.

Regarding “this new experiment,” I also wanted to make sure we had not missed some practical matter when considering our “traffic flow.” Overall, it has gone very well, especially the sanitizing of church.

I'll take this occasion to share some things I've observed just two weeks into this “experiment”:

--“Church doors will be unlocked 30 minutes before Mass begins.” There's no reason to stand outside in line!!!

--“Masks are welcomed and encouraged.” So far, many have been wearing masks but certainly not all. Only the Greeters are required to wear masks when they are actively fulfilling their responsibilities.

--“Please enter through the main entrance of church.” It works best to use the Trane parking because we're asking everyone to use two of the 3 double doors at the main entrance. Those who enter the Parish Hall from our parking lot will be asked to journey to the main entrance like everyone else. If this seems unclear, please view the May 28 video “A Preview of the Return to Public Mass.” (I've been told I make a good 85-year-old. I'll let the video do the explaining of that one!) We do have special exceptions for those who struggle to walk.

--“Seating in church: It will not be possible to be seated in your favorite pew, receive an ‘end pew seat,’ or reserve space for those who are coming later.” This is a little sticky. We're all creatures of habit, in some way; and many habits are built on good reasons, such as “I'm a bit claustrophobic” and “I need to sit closer to the bathroom.” There are other reasons which are less compelling, such as “But I don't like sitting in front” and “I've never sat here before; my spot is over there and no one's sitting in it yet. Why can't I go there!?” Please remember, we're trying to do our best to maximize capacity while respecting social distancing. This means following Diocesan guidelines and limiting the amount of times people walk past each other within 6 feet. Additionally, as the numbers increase, we don't want to turn people away because we haven't used our seating capacity well. Please give the Greeters time to assist you.

--“Greeters will assist with dismissal.” This seems to be a tough one. We know what it's like to wait at funerals and weddings to be dismissed, so I know we can do it. However, some people hear: “The Lord be with you... May almighty God bless you... The Mass is ended; go in peace” as “On your mark... Get set... Go!” We ask that everyone wait for the Closing Hymn to conclude and allow the Greeters to dismiss row by row.

Those are some observations. Your patience is most helpful...and most apparent! There are only a few items that need attention.

I'll conclude with where I began: an invitation. EVERYONE IS WELCOME! Everyone is responsible for oneself and needs to make a personal decision with consideration of how it affects others. The goal isn't to make people dread their 65<sup>th</sup> birthday as if the church is locked to them. You won't be judged for coming to church or for not coming to church. If you feel any hesitation, feel comfortable staying at home. If you feel you need to be in church, come to church. Unless you are sick, you're welcome to be here for Mass. Please follow the Greeters instructions. Let them sanitize the church. This is a safe place, but there are risks everywhere we go.

Please be assured of my prayers for you and your loved ones. Please keep our First Communicants in prayer these three weeks as we celebrate their First Communion in small groupings.

## STATEMENT OF THE CATHOLIC BISHOPS OF WISCONSIN ON UNJUST KILLINGS AND RECENT PROTESTS

Dearly Beloved,

In this traumatic time, we join with our brother bishops and committee chairmen of United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) in expressing our anger and tremendous sorrow over the recent brutal death of George Floyd and the violence that people of color have suffered at the hands of vigilantes and unprincipled public authorities across our nation. These unjust acts have unfortunately plagued our state and nation for centuries. All of us must respond with prayer, solidarity, and solace for the victims and their families, but this continuing brutality calls for even greater effort and action.

We encourage everyone to examine any attitudes of racism within themselves or others that contribute to a culture of disrespect of the dignity and rights of every human person. As noted in the USCCB statement “People of good conscience must never turn a blind eye when citizens are being deprived of their human dignity and even their lives. Indifference is not an option. ‘As bishops, we unequivocally state that racism is a life issue.’”

“Too many communities around this country feel their voices are not being heard, their complaints about racist treatment are unheeded, and we are not doing enough to point out that this deadly treatment is antithetical to the Gospel of Life.”

May God change all our hearts, allowing us to recognize, cherish, and defend the dignity of every human life, for everyone is made in the image and likeness of God and deserves to live free from fear and harm.

We support and join with those who speak out against injustice and applaud efforts to peaceably protest against the murder of George Floyd and others who have been struck down by prejudice and abuse of power. We echo the call for swift and certain justice and we condemn the actions of those who resort to violence, which only further damages underserved communities and distracts from the issues that need our attention.

We implore, for the safety of all, that those who protest in public, especially in communities of color, take appropriate preventative measures to avoid the further spread of COVID-19. Our communities of color in Wisconsin are facing disproportionately high rates of COVID-19 infection. Needless spread will only compound challenges in these communities.

We ask our parishes to engage in formation and activities designed to address racism. One starting point is to utilize the USCCB pastoral letter against racism, *Open Wide Our Hearts*, and the accompanying study guide. We ask our pastors and lay people to reach out personally to their fellow parishioners who face daily discrimination and who are experiencing so much sorrow and pain. As the recent USCCB statement notes, we must “encounter and more authentically accompany them, listen to their stories, and learn from them, finding substantive ways to enact systemic change.”

We urge Catholics to investigate what resources and organizations exist locally to combat racism and to assist those most impacted by it. Please reach out to and share resources, especially during these uncertain times, with houses of worship and other groups within our communities of color throughout Wisconsin.

We pray for the countless lives brutally ended by acts of oppression. We pledge to their families and communities that the Catholic Church stands with them and will redouble its efforts to hold perpetrators accountable, to advocate for just laws, and to offer our time and our treasure so that all may live in freedom and dignity.

May we all be vigilant in searching for the face of God in every encounter and interaction, following our Lord’s command to “Love one another.”

### *TV/Online Masses*

KQEG will use our Live stream of the 4 PM Mass and broadcasted it at 10 AM on Sunday. We will continue this and pay for this valued service. Also, the 7:30 AM weekday Masses will be live streamed on our website until they become public.

### *Sacrament of Reconciliation*

Individual Confessions will be available Wednesdays 4-5 PM in the Mother’s Room and by appointment. Confessions will not be available on Saturdays as we focus on the orderly seating for the 4 PM Mass.

## *New Liturgical Ministries*

**Ministry of Greeter** A new ministry has been created to meet the diocesan regulations for safe, orderly movement in/out of church and for sanitizing the church after every Mass. This ministry will be simplified when these health directives are relaxed. For now, this ministry is open to those 14-64 years old who are willing to...

-arrive 30+ minutes before Mass

-wear mask and gloves during active ministry times (supplied by parish)

-select among 3 kinds of Greeter options: Welcome (at doors), Worship Aid (distribution), and Seating

-remain after Mass to sanitize pews/chairs, door handles, bathrooms, etc.

We were blessed to have 53 volunteers trained before opening public Masses on May 30-31. We need many more volunteers so we can lengthen the schedule rotation. A training session will be held 6:30 PM on June 16 (Tues). No registration needed.

**Live Streaming** The Sunday obligation is still suspended, at-risk people are encouraged to stay home, and daily Mass remains private (limited to 9 people) until Bishop Callahan allows them to be public. So we will continue to provide televised Mass on our YouTube channel for the foreseeable future. A new lay liturgical ministry has come up during the pandemic: Live-streaming video of celebrations at MMOC, including Masses, Baptisms, weddings, and funerals. This has been deeply appreciated by those who cannot attend. Right now we have one person serving in this role. It would be great to have a few more people to make sure we can cover all events. This ministry requires a bit of tech savvy to operate our AV system and our YouTube channel. Full training will be provided. **Building Our Future Together**

Last week we mentioned a final roof project “walk through” with Ledegar, HSR, and FHI on June 4. The meeting was essentially routine and uneventful. For example, there will be a mesh screen installed over the church chimney. With the new high efficiency boilers, the chimney will no longer be used. The screen will help prevent bats, birds and debris from nesting or flying inside. (Santa will be able to open the screen so he will still be able to fill Father’s stocking!) A representative from the company that manufactured the new rubber membrane on the roof will be coming to do a post-installation inspection. It is an assurance there were no noticeable defects in the material and that it was installed according to their specifications for warranty purposes. The new roofs carry a 20-year material warranty and 10-year labor warranty.

Some of you may have noticed the yellow railing on top of the rectory roof and the church roof. There is a hatch for roof access in those spots. Newer codes require a safety railing around such openings. With the new roof installation, we were no longer “grandfathered” under the code and were required to comply.

Krause Construction completed the cleaning of the aluminum fascia around the church, rectory and offices as well as the spire over the main entrance. The cleaning really made the aluminum brighter.



In the church, Poellinger Electric has installed two new 1' x 4' light panels along the north wall. This a sample new product testing both looks as well as installation feasibility.
